From the President

Since the last Bulletin we have now held the Annual Exhibition and what a splendid Exhibition it was. The weather was not brilliant, in fact it was unexpectedly chilly for the time of year. The standard of work submitted was one to be proud of. My congratulations to all those members who received acceptances to the Exhibition. As the standard was so high some entrants will have not had their work accepted. I hope this will not deter

you from trying again next year. I have on many occasions been disappointed myself, receiving total rejection for prints when some had done extremely well in National and International Exhibitions. I can remember on one occasion when all my prints were rejected, not a single print or projected image had been accepted. I vowed that would be the last time I would enter the EAF exhibition. However, the next year I was persuaded to put the same selection in again. I reluctantly agreed. To my surprise and delight three were accepted and one, "Broken Gate", was awarded the best monochrome print in the Exhibition. This taught me a lot. One was, that because a judge or judges might not like your images, another judge or judges may have a different opinion of your work. So take heart from my experience and the next time you have rejections try again after all it's only the judgment of three people.

At the 2015 PDI championships it was my pleasure to present the award of Associate of the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain to Barry Freeman APAGB. I cannot think of a more deserving photographer to be given this award. Barry has served on the EAF Executive for a good many years and for a long time served on the Exhibition Sub Committee and although no longer a member, still helps with the setting up of the Exhibition each year. Barry, as well as Bulletin Editor for the EAF is also responsible for his own Society's Bulletin. Barry has been a member of several clubs in our Federation and is presently a long standing member of Ipswich. Well done Barry you have now become one of a very few to receive this distinction.

During the past few months I was also invited to the seventy-fifth anniversary of Colchester Camera Club, a tremendous achievement given the short existence for many other clubs. I thoroughly enjoyed being with you for the night and being part of your celebrations.

PAGB Club Projected Digital Image (PDI) Championships – 11th July 2015 University of Warwick's Art Centre.

Clubs representing the EAF at Warwick this year were Beyond Group and Norfolk Photography Group. I am really pleased to report that both clubs got through to the Final where the top 9 clubs, out of the 38 who took part that day, competed for top club. Norfolk Photography Group finished 8th on 224 points and Beyond Group came 9th on 216 point – the top score was 244.

Thanks to Beyond Group and Norfolk Photography Group for selecting and taking their entry to Warwick. We look forward to seeing them at Warwick again next year along with another two selected EAF clubs. If your club would like to join them, do take part in the 2016 EAF Championship.

EXHIBITION SECRETARY

Saturday 2nd May 2015 at 14.00 hours saw the opening of our Annual Exhibition, held for the second year at Wingfield Barns, Church Road, Wingfield, Eye, Suffolk IP21 5RA, by our President Bob Norris EFIAP APAGB. This was followed by the presentation of awards and Projection of the Digital Images. Once again the opening day was very well supported with standing room only for some. Many of our award winners attended too, which is always good to see.

I am grateful to the Sub Committee, a large proportion of the Main Committee, Alan Turner, Mike Dobson, Barbara Norris, Sheila Birch, Pam Hainsworth, Ron & Jean Pain, Chris Thurston and Adele Gibson, for their invaluable work over the judging weekend at the end of March. The team, as always, worked together ensuring that all ran smoothly. Our three judges, David Gibbins, Malcolm Kus and Leo Rich also worked well together and provided us, once again as we asked, with a good range of subject matter across all genres.

Visitor numbers over the whole Exhibition opening period were excellent (the lady in charge of the Gallery told me she considered it was even higher this year, in the region of 700) and much higher than we ever saw at the Gibberd Gallery, Harlow. This is very much helped by the fact that the Gallery is open over the weekends and also on the Bank Holiday Monday. It was also pleasing to note that we received visitors from throughout the region, as Wingfield is much more centrally placed – even though the road access is "narrow" for the last few miles! Overall, our Membership seems happy with the Wingfield venue and the fact that they can get to it over the weekend or Bank Holiday too. I have however been asked on a couple of occasions when out Judging this year, why we hold our Exhibition "in the middle of nowhere" – but these have mostly come from Club Members who live much closer to Harlow. Strangely enough, none of them have shown any interest in taking over the role of Exhibition Secretary and perhaps finding another suitable, central, venue! It also shows they have not read previous Bulletins, where the change of venue has been explained many times.

I am also grateful to the Exhibition sub Committee and Alan Turner, Barbara Norris, Sheila Birch and José Currant, for their invaluable help with the panelling, set up and/or taking down of the Exhibition. As always, this was completed in a very efficient manner.

For those interested, the Exhibition Statistics were:

Monochrome prints: 183 (160 – 2014) members from 41 (41) clubs entered 459 (403) prints of which 101 (99) from 28 (28) clubs were accepted.

Colour prints: 204 (216) members from 44 (43) clubs entered 566 (555) prints of which 118 (133) from 29 (27) clubs were accepted.

Digital images: 286 (268) members from 49 (49) clubs entered 1052 (982) images of which 219 (195) from 42 (45) clubs were selected.

Overall: 345 (345) members of 49 (50) clubs entered work for selection; of those, 192 (184) members from 46 (47) clubs had their work accepted.

The PAGB Inter-Federation Competitions and Exhibitions of Prints and PDI again took place in June.

It is pleasing to report that our Federation ranked well in each section this year, despite our massive entry and the averaging of marks. Out of the 15 Federations, our positions were:

Thank you once again to all the Competition Secretaries who completed the CD's with print images I know it is a daunting task, but please be assured your work was very worthwhile and much appreciated by me. The timescale for our requiring the images means that there is no way I could cope with writing to everyone for just the accepted images and checking they are all received back by return. In addition it continues to provide much better images for the catalogue, Portfolio and PAGB.

2016 Exhibition

Wingfield Barns has been booked again – with the opening date being Saturday 7th May (official opening time 14.00 hours by our own President) – closing midday on Sunday 22^{nd} May. Submission Guidelines for the Events Diary & Posters

PAGB Executive Member Daphne Hanson DPAGB APAGB

The Annual General Meeting of the PAGB took place in London on Saturday 11th April 2015, attended on behalf of the EAF by Mrs Sue Dobson CPAGB APAGB, Mike Dobson, Ian Kippax EFIAP DPAGB, Mrs Naomi Saul ARPS DPAGB EFIAP APAGB, Paul Radden LRPS DPAGB EFIAP and myself.

The PAGB Treasurer reported a surplus of £4,871 as at 31^{st} December 2014, £2,513 higher than budget. It was agreed that club subscriptions remain at £34.75 for 2016 and that the 2014 Annual Review, Report & Statement of Accounts & Balance Sheet as at 31^{st} December 2014 be adopted as drawn.

The outgoing President Leo Rich said he had presented numerous Awards for Meritorious Service and Photographic Merit during his term of office and had always received a warm welcome when visiting Federations. He then officially handed over the Presidency to the newly elected President, Roy Thomas APAGB HonFWPF, who thanked Leo for his hard work and leadership during the past two years in office.

The Officers and Executive Committee Members were re-elected with the exception of the L&CPU Member and the Honorary Solicitor. The L&CPU Member has since been appointed and an Honorary Solicitor is still sought. The meeting ended with each Federation giving a short presentation of events and workshops that had taken place during the year.

Proposed changes to the PAGB Constitution & Rules were outlined to the meeting and were adopted as follows:

Rule 4 (Use of Sub-titles)

In the second paragraph, before the word 'Societies' insert 'Affiliated'.

Rule 6 (Establishment of Boundaries). Replace with the following:

6. Establishment of Boundaries

(a) The Alliance may adjust the boundaries of Member Federations consequent on the admission of a Member (rule 5), withdrawal of a Member (rule 8), dismissal of a Member (rule 9), or on request by an existing Member or an applicant group. The Alliance will only assume this responsibility after all reasonable attempts at agreement have proved unsuccessful.

(b) An existing Society affected by a boundary change may either change its Federation membership to match the new boundaries, or may retain its existing Federation membership.

(c) A new Society may only join the Federation within whose boundaries it is located, except where that Federation grants its permission for the new Society to first join another Federation.

(d) A Member Society of a Federation shall be permitted also to seek membership of another Federation.

Rule 7 (Society Affiliation). Replace with the following:

7. Society Affiliation

(a) Except as provided by rule 7(b) or rule 7(c), all Member Societies of the Member Federations will be Affiliated to the Alliance.

(b) A Society which fails the test set out in Schedule One may not be Affiliated to the Alliance.

(c) Where a Society is a member of more than one Federation, then the Society will be Affiliated to the Alliance through only one Federation, which will normally be that in which it is located. An alternative Federation for Affiliation may be agreed between the parties.

(d) Federations will inform the Alliance of any Society which is not Affiliated, and the reason for that decision.

Schedule One. Add, following the Rules:

Schedule One

(a) This Schedule provides the test for Affiliation of a Society required by rule 7(b).(b) A Society may be Affiliated to the Alliance only if it is:

A camera club, photographic society, photographic club or photographic group with a published constitution and published programme of events, united by a common interest in photography, meeting in person for mutual co-operation, education, entertainment or competition solely from a physical location within Great Britain, Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

(c) The test for Affiliation of a Society shall be made by the Federation.

(d) The definition at (b) in this Schedule may be amended by the Alliance Executive.

The FIAP Liaison Officer reported that the only change regarding the new Distinction Rules published in December 2014 was regarding the number of acceptances from any one country used towards a FIAP application which has been varied from 10% to 15%. MFIAP Distinction entry fee is now £110 and the deadline for applications is 15th December. FIAP Distinction Rules are published on the PAGB website.

Judging of the 26th FIAP Colour Print Biennial took place in June with 26 countries entering 10 prints each on the theme of 'Coherence'. The World Cup went to Argentina with the FIAP Gold Medal awarded to the PAGB, the Silver Medal to Ireland and the Bronze Medal to Scotland.

The Selectors were Rod Wheelans MFIAP FRPS MPAGB HonPAGB (Scotland), Herbert Gmeiner EFIAP Hon EFIAP (FIAP) and Bob Moore EFIAP HonFRPS MPAGB HonPAGB (England).

The Official Opening of the Colour Print Biennial will take place on Saturday 5th September 2015 at Smethwick PS Clubrooms, The Old School House, Churchbridge, Oldbury B69 2AS. Awards will be presented by the President of FIAP, Riccardo Busi.

Inter-club PDI Championship: Over 400 people attended this year's event at Warwick University on Saturday 11th July, sponsored by Darwin Clayton (UK) Ltd and Fotospeed, with 16 companies donating Raffle prizes. The Champion Club and winner of the Darwin Clayton Trophy and PAGB Gold Medal was Wigan 10 Foto Group (L&CPU) who won by 1 point from Inn Focus Group (WPF). The Plate Competition was won by Chorley Photographic Society (L&CPU). Next year's event will take place on Saturday 16th July 2016.

Inter-club Print Championship: This year's event will take place on Sunday 25th October 2015 at The Chatfield Theatre in the University Academy at Ellesmere Port, Cheshire CH65 6EA. Tickets at £10.00 each are available from Mrs Christine Langford, Ty-Ni, Gwydryn Drive, Abersoch LL53 7HU. See e-news for an application form.

Inter-Federation Print & Projected Digital Image Competitions/Exhibitions:

Both Competitions/Exhibitions sponsored by Sony were judged on Saturday 20th June at The Kings Centre, Burgess Hill hosted by Kent County Photographic Association.

The Monochrome Print Competition and the Open PDI Competition was won by The North & East Midlands Photographic Federation. The Colour Print Competition and the Nature PDI Competition was won by The Lancashire & Cheshire Photographic Union. Gold and Silver Medals, together with PAGB Ribbons were awarded by the Selectors: Clive Tanner FRPS DPAGB, Richard Walton FRPS MPAGB EFIAP and Leo Rich ARPS DPAGB APAGB EFIAP/g. Next year's Inter-Federation Competitions will be hosted by Northern Ireland Photographic Association.

PAGB Great British Cup:

Judging took place on 7th, 8th & 9th February 2015 with 98 clubs entering the 'Open' section, 58 clubs the 'Small Clubs' category and 97 clubs in 'Nature'. The GB Cup 'Open' and the GB Cup 'Nature' was won by Wigan 10 and the GB Cup 'Small Clubs' category by Catchlight Camera Club. Participating clubs should receive CDs in August. A GB Cup for Prints is planned for later in the year.

Recorded Lecture Service: RLS Secretary, Stephanie Cook, is urgently seeking new lectures, especially Nature CDs, as several lectures will be archived this year.

PAGB Website: Work is still progressing on the new website. The e-news website has been revamped and is now linked to the main PAGB website. Members are encouraged to sign up to receive e-news direct.

Insurance: There was no increase in premiums for 2015. As from 1st February 2015 Darwin Clayton adopted the new definition of a club for all insurance policies issued to affiliated clubs in the PAGB. Federations should therefore make sure that clubs meet this definition if they wish to participate in the PAGB insurance schemes and enter PAGB events and competitions.

Awards for Photographic Merit: New charges will be introduced for the Awards as from April 2016: DPAGB - £90 MPAGB - £120. CPAGB will remain at £60.

Three adjudications are underway: August 2015 in Ormskirk, November 2015 in Port Talbot and April 2016, hosted by NCPF (venue to be advised). The Awards Advisory desk on the PAGB stand at The Photography Show, NEC proved extremely popular and it is hoped to offer this service at the Show next year.

Awards in Audio Visual are again planned at The Village Hall, Steventon on 21st/22nd May 2016.
