Paul has also been elected as our new President-Elect.

CHAMPIONSHIP SECRETARY

On 11th February a total of 28 clubs took part in the PDI Championships to decide which clubs would represent us at Warwick in the corresponding PAGB event. There were three clubs (Caister PC, Dunmow PC, and Mersea Island PS) who had not previously entered this competition. The judges were

Mike Sharples MFIAP MPAGB FBPE ARPS EFIAP,

Carol McNiven Young FRPS EFIAP/b DPAGB BPE5*, and

Gianpiero Ferrari EFIAP FRPS DPAGB FBPE.

After a first round of 15 images per club, the top 11 scoring clubs had their remaining 10 images judged and the winning clubs were announced.

PICO won with 308 points. Second were Beyond Group with 302 points, and third were Colchester PS with 293 points.

Best Rookie club award went to Caister PC who were in 13th Place overall with 166 points – a very creditable performance.

Individual awards from the judges were as follows:-

Carol McNiven Young chose 'Bow fiddle rock rough seas' by Wayne Davey of Beyond Group; Gianpiero Ferrari chose 'Pelican Reflections at Dawn' by Kevin Williams of Bury St Edmunds PS;

Clive Downes of Cambridge CC. Best image award went to 'Leveret' by Sophia Spurgin of Bishops Stortford CC

The judges were very complimentary of the quality of all the images.

The PAGB holds adjudication weekends for awards at the end of April and November every year. Each Federation takes it in turn to host these events every 7 to 8 years. EXHIBITION SECRETARY

Don't forget to sort out your entries for the 2024 EAF Exhibition. This takes place at Wingfield Barns, Church Road, Wingfield, Diss IP21 5RA between Saturday 4th May and Sunday 19th May. Our President, Nick Akers ARPS BPE4*, will open the exhibition in the Main Barn on Saturday 4th at 2pm and present the awards. This will be followed by a large screen projection of the PDI entries, after which you will be able to browse the accepted prints in the two galleries opposite. The galleries will be open between the 5th and 19th May between 11am and 4pm, including the Bank Holiday Monday (6th) but closed on both Tuesdays and Monday 13th. It will close at 1pm on the final day – Sunday 19th. This year you can enter up to four colour prints, four mono prints and four PDI images. Entry is via your club and full details of how to do so can be found on the EAF Website in the Downloadable Documents section under the 'Info' tab. This year we will be using on-line transfer to enter your image files instead of the CD/DVD method of past years. Entry forms have been updated and revised to reflect this change. Selection will take place over the weekend of 6th / 7th April by Leo Rich ARPS DPAGB HonPAGB EFIAP/g, Glyn Edmunds ARPS DPAGB EFIAP/g and Jean Brooks EFIAP/s. Check with your Club's representative for the

closing date for entry of your images. Don't miss the opportunity to see how your work relates to others in the region!

A full catalogue of accepted entries will be compiled and free-issued to all Club Members who have made an entry. This is distributed by your Club. We will also be producing a PDI-based Portfolio presentation which can be purchased for viewing afterwards – perhaps as a Club program evening.

Please save the date for the opening in your diary, especially if you have won an award – it's always nice to pick these up in person. If you can't make the opening day, please come along to visit the galleries during the rest of the two weeks. All accepted prints will be displayed, together with a rolling PDI display on a screen in the main gallery.

On a final note – I am always looking for volunteers to help with stewarding at the exhibition. If you think you could help with this please get in touch and I will be happy to discuss a suitable day for you to do so. Your help will be greatly appreciated.

EAF CLUB WINS PAGB GB CUP NATURE

North Norfolk PS has won the prestigious GB CUP for Nature run by the PAGB for the second year running. However this year they were pushed by Poulton-le-Fylde and only won by one point. There were over 1300 images entered from over 50 Clubs so it is quite an achievement. The Gold Medal winning image,

CLUB PROFILE THE BEYOND GROUP

The Beyond Group started up in February 2005 as a result of unacceptable censorship in another club. The original five members meeting up in each others houses, but it wasn't long before they had to find more suitable premises as the numbers grew. It was only when they reached fifteen that they decided to cap the membership, rather than look once more for bigger premises. The aims of the group have always been to push each other to improve, to enter exhibitions, to gain distinctions, to give talks and become judges. They also love to embrace different photographic styles, so not every member necessarily wants to do all those things mentioned, but instead are happy to share their unique

knowledge with the group. They have never sought out people with the highest distinctions, but more interested in taking members on their photographic journey to those dizzying heights.

Members do not compete against each other nor do they compete in inter-club battles. Instead they all critique each others work on a weekly basis. They do however have the occasional speaker, a popular night for instance is when they have five top photographers, who each show and talk about ten of their own images. They also hold the occasional studio meeting and the odd day out. Since joining and competing in the EAF Championships in 2006, the Bevond Group have become the most successful club ever within the EAF. Representing the region in both the

In 2022 the Beyond Group also came third in the FIAP World Cup, an achievement they are all so proud of. Four of them went to Italy for the presentation. The group meets in a hall twice a month throughout the year, with meetings via Zoom held in the weeks in between. Currently they have just 13 members who come from far and wide across the EAF.

In 2008 the Beyond Group held it's first annual BPE National exhibition, which attracted just over 3,000 entries from all over the UK, this was so successful that they now attract over 5,500 entries every year. The exhibition shows the very best of work from photographers from across

the UK, with the whole membership helping to run it as it is quite a mammoth task. The catalogue produced is second to none and is always held is high esteem. I would encourage everybody to enter the exhibition and give it a go. They may find themselves hooked on this other path of photography. Go to http:// beyondgroup.info for more information. CAMBRIDGE DIGITAL INTER-CLUB

On 20th January representatives of Clubs from across the EAF came together again at Whittlesford Memorial Hall for the annual PDI competition organised by Cambridge CC. This year 28 clubs did battle with images being critiqued and marked by our Judge, Barbie Lindsay MPAGB EFIAP/s FBPE AWPF from the Beyond Group. The competition comprises five rounds - Monochrome, People, Landscape, Nature and Open. Each club enters one image in each category. They are then critiqued and awarded a score out of 20 by the judge. The marks are then totalled to arrive at the overall winning Club who take away the John Lewis Trophy. Clubs also submit a sixth "Open" image for

This year's winners were Photographic Image Cooperative (PICO) from Peterborough. They scored a fantastic total of 96 points from a possible 100. favourite image of the day for the Roy Pitman Plate award, which went to Peter North from Melbourn & DPC for his image entitled 'Last Leaves'. A big thanks to all who supported the competition – this year was the second 'In-Person' run following the Pandemic and it was great to see so many familiar faces again at the venue and an increase in Clubs and audience members taking part. Next year's competition date is Saturday 25th January 2025 – make a note in the diary!

I will be handing over the organisation of the competition to Sally Freeman for next year, so please join me in wishing her every success!
